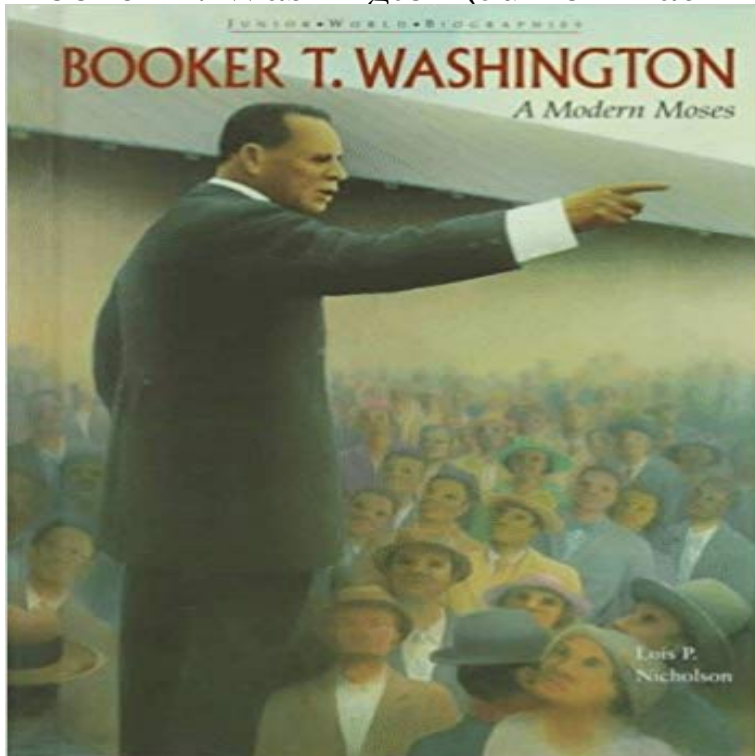


Booker T. Washington (Junior Black Americans of Achievement)
