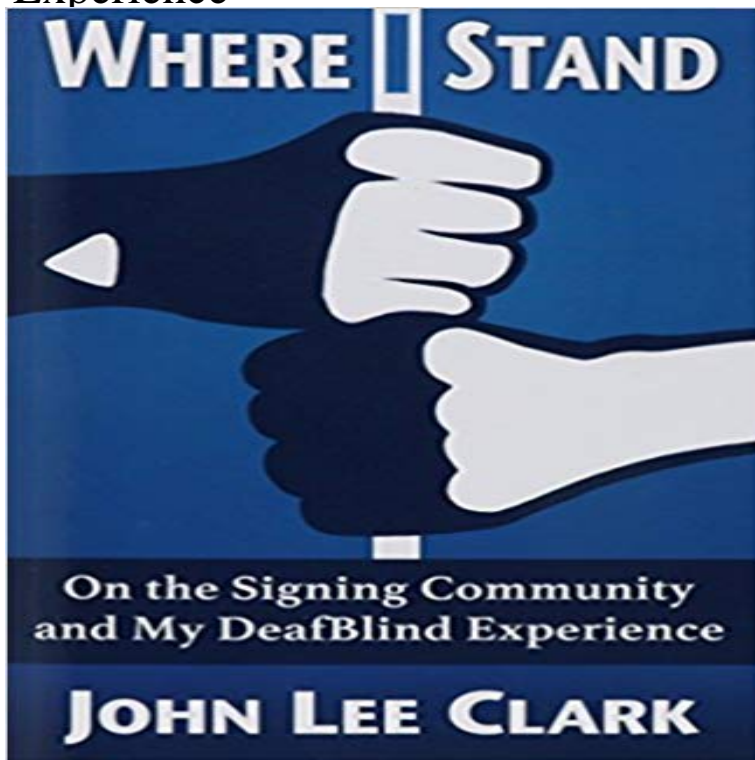


Where I Stand: On the Signing Community and My DeafBlind Experience
