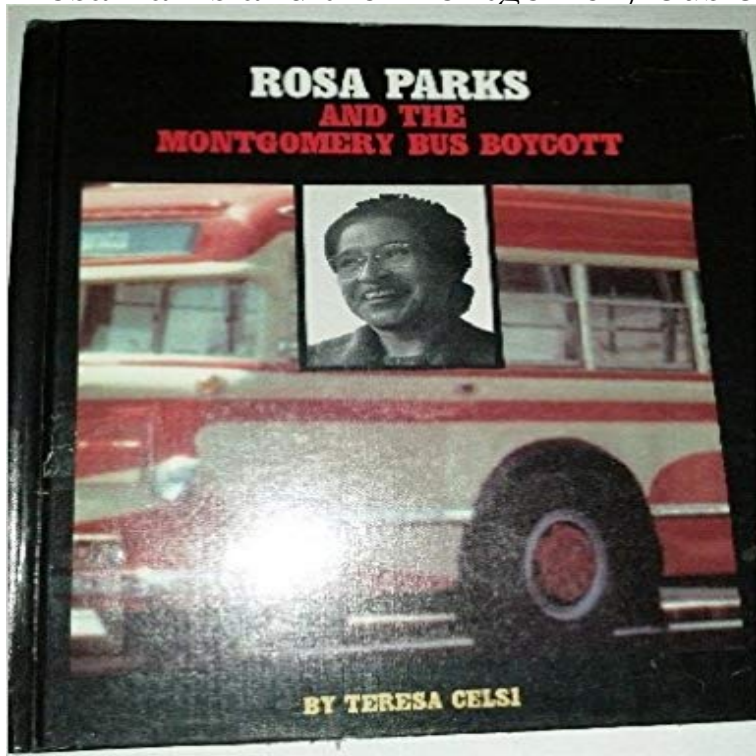


Rosa Parks and the Montgomery bus boycott
