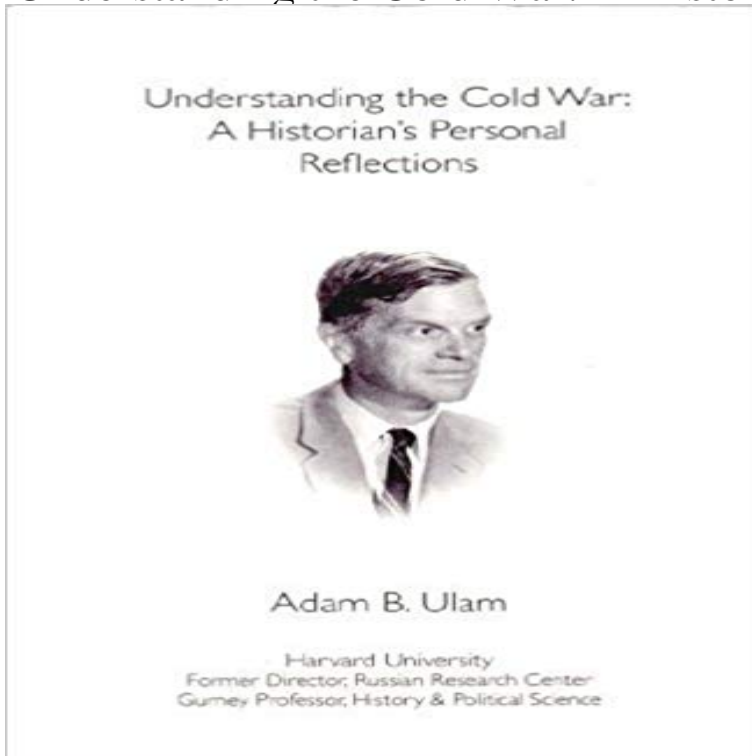


Understanding the Cold War: A Historians Personal Reflections



The book contains engaging stories of Prof. Ulam's personal life which are interspersed with his reflections on the dominant events of the 20th Century, notably the rise and fall of the Soviet Union. The book proceeds from his dramatic departure at 16 from Lwow, Poland, only 6 days before Hitler's invasion, to his long tenure as one of the leading voices at Harvard. In recounting his life and summarizing the main themes of his 18 books, Ulam leaves a legacy, at once intensely personal and historically illuminating. He knew everyone from John Kenneth Galbraith, Alfred North Whitehead, and Edward Teller, to Pierre Trudeau and Andreas Papandreu. More intimate stories feature family members like his older brother Stanislaw, the famous Manhattan-project mathematician, who accompanied the teen-aged Adam in his flight to America and to whom the book is dedicated.
